Supported Services for Veteran Families

The purpose of the SSVF program is to promote housing stability among low-income veteran families who reside in, or are transitioning to, permanent housing. In addition to providing housing assistance the program provides services that include (but are not limited to) the following: case management, assistance to obtaining other VA services/benefits, financial planning, food resources, transportation, childcare, linkages to primary and mental health care, and outreach.

Program Qualifications

Be a Veteran, or the member of a family in which the head of household, or the spouse of the head of household is a Veteran. A Veteran is defined as a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service, regardless of length of service, and who was discharged or released there from, excluding anyone who received a dishonorable discharge or was discharged or dismissed by reason of a General court-martial (PL 114-315; 38 USC § 2002(b)).

Meet income eligibility requirements: Your household annual income cannot exceed 50% of the area median income (AMI).

Be homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless.
